



Recruitment

 - Subspecialty selection
- Local recruitment for core and higher training
- Fill rates are higher in NI than other areas of the UK


Training Challenges

How would you rate the ease of communication among trainees for non clinical discussions e.g. news about events or training?





Do you think it would be useful to have a deanery-wide forum or app to share relevant information for trainees while rotating through core and higher training in psychiatry?



Workplace- A Pilot Project

- In Severn deanery, Workplace had been set up by a trainee, for trainees to communicate more easily
- Approved by Dr Lovett (Dean), local Head of School and medical education leads in local trusts
- Up and running ~2 years, 200 members
- Feedback positive

- Project subsequently adopted by the PTC as part of our engagement work.


