EAP HIGHLIGHTS

• The EAP team has been working with a number of a Child and Adolescent Consultant Specialist Members to remotely record, edit and publish a series of videos titled "Supporting Families of Young People with Mental Illness during Covid-19". There are now five videos, with each contributor havingg scripted, set-up and recorded their piece to camera in their home or office, with guidance from the EAP dept who then edited, branded and published the videos on the College YouTube channel and website.



- A variety of communications were employed to circulate and promote the video series including press statements, Twitter, correspondence with relevant stakeholders and newsletters to CPsychl members. Following correspondence to the Department of Health the series will also feature on the official government website under the "In This Together" section as well as the HSE site yourmentalhealth.ie.
- Two separate letters drafted by the Faculty of Intellectual Disability were sent to Minister for Health Simon Harris expressing concerns re. the risks of COVID-19 and related challenges for those with an Intellectual Disability living in a residential setting and the need for additional support for carers/families of children with ID at home. This correspondence was additionally highlighted on Twitter.
- Dr Anne Jeffers will take up the role of Policy Lead for the College in mid-May 2020, working with the External Affairs and Policy Department and current EAP Director, Dr Maeve Doyle.
- With the formation of a coalition government seeming imminent the College has written to the leaders of the major political parties outlining the priority mental health service provision must take in the new programme for government particularly in the aftermath of COVID-19, highlighting the need for development of well-funded and staffed, recovery-orientated mental health services as well as additional supports required for healthcare workers and those affected adversely by Covid-19.
- Irish Journal of **Psychological Medicine**

Dr John Lyne (Editor), Prof Fiona McNicholas and Dr Blanaid Gavin have been working on a COVID-19 special edition of the Irish Journal of Psychological Medicine. A large number of submissions have been received and approved and it is hoped that the issue will be released

online in mid-May, with a print version to follow towards the end of summer. A media release of the issue by the EAP department is being planned at present.

REFOCUS - RECOVERY EXPERIENCE FORUM OF CARERS AND USERS OF SERVICES Joint Chairs: Dr Mia McLoughlin and Ms Christine McCabe **AIMS**:

To engage actively in genuine partnership with the College so that training, ongoing competence and day to day practice of Psychiatry is informed and guided by those who have had experience of mental illness, or who have cared for those with mental illness. The forum comprises 23 members which includes service users/patients (8), family members/carers (8) & psychiatrists (8)

- Diarmaid Ring has been appointed Joint-Chair of REFOCUS and will take up this position at the September meeting. The group would like to sincerely thank outgoing Joint-Chair, Christine McCabe, for her dedication to REFOCUS over the past few years.
- Approval in principle has been granted in relation a proposed suite of videos on the themes of "Psychiatric Diagnosis" and
 "Family Dynamics". Between 6 and 8 short videos will be produced in-house by the EAP Team and will feature REFOCUS
 members.
- Owing to the success of the day, it has been proposed and accepted in principle that the Monetary Impact of Mental Illness symposium is run again in the future.
