#### **EAP HIGHLIGHTS**

- A survey of College Specialist Members has been carried out in order to assess the
  impact COVID-19 and related restrictions have had on mental health service delivery,
  particularly if members have seen an increase in referrals or a change in the complexity of
  presentations. Dr Eric Kelleher has compiled a <u>summary report</u> on the findings which will form
  the basis of several communications to Oireachtas members & Government officials, national
  media and key stakeholders.
- The EAP department have proposed terms of reference for a new Covid College 'taskforce'. The group will collate learnings from service adaptations during the pandemic to identify policies and guidance for mental health services going forward and will focus on informing government, stakeholders and members.

- A letter from Dr William Flannery, College President, was sent to all major political parties outlining concern around the impact of COVID-19 on an already underfunded, under -resourced Mental Health Services and the priority mental illness and services must take in the next Programme of Government. A press statement highlighting same was issued.
- The virtual issue of the "COVID-19 and Mental Health" special edition of the IJPM was launched to national media, with a media briefing held via Zoom on 8th June. Editor Dr John Lyne and guest editor Prof Fiona McNicholas provided a summary of the topics covered in the edition and answered questions from journalists from a number of national media outlets including the Irish Times, The Irish Examiner and The Journal.ie. The Special Edition was subsequently covered in a number of online and print publications.
- In tandem with the launch of the COVID-19 edition, **the College is co-hosting a series of webinars organised by UCD Academic Child and Adolescent Psychiatry** and Dr Blánaid Gavin and Prof Fiona McNicholas. The webinars take place every Friday up until September. Many of the topics chosen have been based on themes and subjects of articles in the special issue.
- The College released **a statement condemning racism** in the wake of the killing of George Floyd and the protests against systemic racism that have erupted in America and across the world.
- The "Supporting Families of Young People with Mental Illness during Covid-19" video series is now featured on the "In This Together" covid-specific website on gov.ie. and HSE YourMentalHealth.ie

EAP Dept Manager, Andrea Ryder, quoted re. results of survey due to be published: "A large proportion of consultants are reporting that they are now seeing an increase in people experiencing both new-onset and relapse of mental illness compared to the early stages of the lockdown but also to before the lockdown came into place".

Dr William Flannery interviewed and a number of quotes included re. predicted rise in mental illness as a result of the Covid-19 pandemic and related social stressors such as social isolation, job loss and alcohol/drug use, as well as focus on need for increase funding the MHS.

#### HUMAN RIGHTS AND ETHICS COMMITTEE Chair: Dr Pauline Twomey, Vice-Chair: Dr Ciaran Clarke

#### AIMS:

To provide support and advice to the College and its members on the ethical dimension of patient care.

To ensure there is an ethical input into College submissions, policy and position papers.

To ensure members have an awareness and expertise in Human Rights Legislation and its impact on mental health care.

- Dr Ciaran Clarke will shortly take on the role of Chair of the group.
- The Committee are planning to look at human rights aspects of healthcare during a pandemic, associated issues for vulnerable groups, as well as how tribunals were handled, telepsychiatry practices, etc. Also TBD will be associated ethical decision making during a pandemic and related HSE guidance on same.
- Also on the agenda for discussion is racism and affects of same on mental health.
- The Committee have also been asked by the College Postgraduate Training dept. to present the Professional Ethics for Psychiatrists document at Foundation Year Induction once again. This will be recorded/delivered live via videoconference.

## **REFOCUS - RECOVERY EXPERIENCE FORUM OF CARERS AND USERS OF SERVICES** Joint Chairs: Dr Mia McLoughlin and Ms Christine McCabe **AIMS:**
