The Health Service Executive, in partnership with the Postgraduate Training Bodies, is establishing a number of Aspire Post CSCST Fellowships to commence in July 2023 in key areas of need within the Health Service. Applications are now invited for the position of Aspire Post CSCST Fellowship in Early Intervention in Psychosis with a focus on managing metabolic health. The post will be based in the Detect Early Intervention in Psychosis Service, CHO 6. This is a one year fixed term contract. This post offers an opportunity for doctors who have completed the Higher Specialist Training program in psychiatry, for further subspecialty training in the area of monitoring and managing metabolic health in early intervention in psychosis (EIP) and to develop advanced clinical skills.

The Detect EIP service is a tertiary mental health service located in CHO 6 and is Ireland's longest established EIP service (www.detect.ie). The service is part of the National Clinical Programme in EIP. The program is multidisciplinary with integration between the clinical service and clinical research and service evaluation. The service has a track record in hosting previous fellowships, and in clinical innovation and research outputs. The successful applicant will gain experience conducting specialist assessments of referrals, teaching, research and the process of service evaluation. Training in the standardised assessment protocol and instruments will be provided. Additionally, the fellow will develop an expertise in managing and monitoring metabolic health and will developed close links with the National Clinical Programme in EIP.

All applicants must be currently registered with the Irish Medical Council (IMC) and will have completed Higher Specialist Training in psychiatry.
