INTRODUCTION

Welcome to our annual report of activity in the CPsychl Postgraduate Training Department. This report refers to the training year July 21- 22, probably our busiest training year to date. After agreeing a Workforce Planning strategy with HSE NDTP early 2021, we have been permitted to increase our intake to Psychiatry training by 30% over recent years. Our recruitment to BST training is now running at 100% so the absolute numbers of trainees and the occupancy of our training schemes have significantly increased over the last few years. We have also increased the number of new HST posts nationally. We are, therefore, busier than ever and particular thanks must go to Educational Supervisors who participate in Exams, ARPs, teaching and committee work with the College. We would also like to invite any new consultants to become involved in the structures of postgraduate training; we will need your help!

The Covid-19 pandemic has had a huge impact on us all and, in many ways, the effects are still being felt. Some of the adjustments made to training (such as hybrid or online training events)are likely to continue indefinitely. I must commend Trainees, Supervisors, Tutors, Vice Deans and HST Mentors, as well as our College staff, for maintaining their focus on training despite the personal and professional pressures involved. In the Postgraduate Training department, our main priority has been to support trainees in continuing their progress through the training programme while maintaining training standards. Despite the challenges, many new developments have been introduced such as new curricula for new post-CSCST Fellowships; the establishment of online examinations and annual reviews of progress; BST e-learning courses; and accreditation inspections of BST training schemes. Each of our College officers (Dr Fiona Crotty, Head of Continuous Assessment; Dr Martin Mahon, Chief Examiner; Professor Anne Doherty, Head of E-Learning and Courses, Dr Sabina Fahy) and Dr Micheal O'Cuill, Chair of PTC, deserve special mention for their leadership and support throughout this period. Particular thanks must also go to the managers of each of our training departments who have summarized and presented their departments' data here and to Ms Kellie Myers for creating this amalgamated report.

We wish everyone an interesting and productive year ahead.

THE POSTGRADUATE TRAINING COMMITTEE HAS THE RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE DEVELOPMENT AND ONGOING MONITORING OF PSYCHIATRY POSTGRADUATE TRAINING PROGRAMMES IN IRELAND

KEY ACHIEVEMENTS

- HSE NDTP
 - Continued to work with NDTP and NCAGL Mental Health on WFP to ensure the availability of training places for HST July 2022.
 - There has been a small increase in our training SLA going forward which is very welcome
 - The College were successful in a bid for development funding for HST Masterclasses & E-Learning materials which will be free of charge and mandatory for trainees
 - Psychiatry received funding for five Post CSCST Fellowships for recruitment July 2022
 - Specialist Training Funds and Course refund schemes remained in place and available to trainees
- Draft accreditation report received from the Medical Council May 2022, arising from the Postgraduate Training Accreditation process undertaken in May 2021.
- The Regulations and the Curriculum are updated annually. Of note, The Trainee Support Panel and Anonymous Post Appraisals were introduced for July 2022.
- Job Sharing options, supported by NDTP, offered and implemented where possible for BSTs and HSTs.
- The Forum of Postgraduate Training Bodies launched the Strategic Framework for Postgraduate Medical Training in Ireland 2021-2030, CPsychl will engage in this process.
- A survey on the Impact of Patient Suicide on doctors was developed in collaboration with NOSP / NSRF.
- Agreed to develop Balint Leader training in collaboration with the Faculty of Medical Psychotherapy
- Graduation Ceremonies took place for CSCST and Examination recipients at the Winter Conference Thursday 10th November 2021.

- Consider development of Fellowship programmes for International Medical Graduates

KEY ACHIEVEMENTS

BASIC SPECILIST TRAINING

- Recruitment to Basic Specialist Training in Psychiatry successfully completed, offering 80 places across all Deaneries for July 2022.
- In collaboration with the Vice-Deans, College's website enhanced to include useful information on each Deanery for prospective applicants.
- Interviews took place online across 14 panels over two days, 27th /28th Jan 2022. Utilised integrated online marking system.
- Improved communication, resulting in reduction in number of Trainees withdrawing from the competition post matching process / pre-commencement.

HIGHER SPECIALIST TRAINING

- Recruitment to Higher Specialist Training in Adult Psychiatry and Child and Adolescent Psychiatry successfully completed, offering 43 places in total, seven of which were nonstreamlining candidates.
- Interviews took place online via zoom across 6 panels on 24th February 2022
- The allocations process for all HST trainees was completed successfully for July 2022

ASPIRE / POST CSCST FELLOWSHIPS

• Successful recruitment to three Post CSCST Fellowships for training year 2022- 2023

IN DEVELOPMENT / ONGOING ACTIVITIES

- It is expected that for recruitment for July 2023 BST interviews will remain online. HST interviews will revert to a face to face format from February 2023.
- Work is continuing with HSE NDTP to identify intake numbers for July 2023 in both BST and HST and it is expected additional HST posts will be required for General Adult in particular for July 2023.
- The College will continue to work with the Vice Deans to identify suitable BST posts as part of our ongoing work to increase intake numbers at BST level.
- A National Training Capacity project will be undertaken supported by NDTP, to identify nontraining posts for future development of the Psychiatry specialist training programmes.
- Advocacy for continued funding for Aspire / Post CSCST Fellowships for July 2023

KEY ACHIEVEMENTS

- Completion of two examinations with 100% of candidates successfully completing each sitting.
- Hybrid exam format for Summer 2022 with a face-to-face OSCE in Croke Park Stadium and CFME conducted online via Zoom.
- Minimal number of online examination reruns on exam days despite the technological complexity required.
- In-house development of online training resources for examiners and candidates [i.e. Mock online OSCE videos, video demonstrations for examiners, candidate walkthroughs of exam days and the invigilation process etc].
- New Examiner Induction Training, 1st April 2022 (in-person in Croke Park Stadium).
- Refresher Examiner Training, 29th April 2022 (Online via Zoom)
- Standard Setting meetings took place on 23rd September 2021 & 10th March 2022.
- New CFME examiner feedback mechanism integrated post Summer 2022 exam [i.e., allows examiner panels to compare their mean scores with the other panels on the day]. Will also be adopted for the OSCE from Winter 2022.



KEY ACHIEVEMENTS

- Completion of three ARP processes with the largest number of portfolio reviews in any training year to date (13% increase on previous year).
- A new e-portfolio introduced for Senior Registrars commencing HST in July 2021, in addition to the new FYs and those commencing BST 1 in July 2021 also using the system.
- Training webinars were provided for new users of the e-portfolio in July 2021 and January 2022.
- The first ARP process to review HST trainees using the e-portfolio was conducted in May 2022. In total, 134 e-portfolios (107 BST; 27 HST) were reviewed by ARP panels.
- Development of the HST curriculum with addition of learning outcomes for new subspecialty posts in Psychotherapy.
- Trainer Induction for new Educational Supervisors in December 2021, recording also available on Moodle.
- Introduction of Q&A sessions to further assist trainees with queries on the ARP process, curriculum and regulations for training.
- Bespoke curricula devised and agreed with fellows and their respective supervisors for Aspire Post-CSCST Fellowships.



KEY ACHIEVEMENTS

- Appointment of Head of Accreditation in May 2022.
- Seven new HST posts were approved by Accreditation Sub-committee for the July 2022-2023 training year. Of these, three are on the Adult Psychiatry programme and four on the CAP programme.
- The BST Deanery inspections process has progressed with inspections completed in the UL, UCD/MMUH, UCD/SVUH and RCSI Deaneries.
- Approved Deanery inspection reports for UCC and UL inspections are now available to trainees and supervisors on Moodle.
- Revised terms of reference for Accreditation Sub-committee agreed and updated.

IN DEVELOPMENT / ONGOING ACTIVITIES

- NUIG Deanery inspection is scheduled for Autumn 2022. This is the final BST Deanery to be inspected in the first cycle.
- Application process for new posts commencing in August 2022, with particular focus on new HST posts for the Adult Psychiatry programme.
