Dr Daniel Gorman

Dr. Daniel Gorman's clinical and academic interests include attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder, Tourette syndrome, obsessive-compulsive disorder, child psychopharmacology, and medical education. He has authored or co-authored over 30 articles and book chapters, mainly related to childhood neuropsychiatric disorders and their pharmacological management. He also contributed to Canadian guidelines on cardiac risk assessment before the use of stimulants, management of tic disorders, and pharmacotherapy for childhood disruptive and aggressive behaviour. He is a member of the Research and Scientific Program Committee of the Canadian Academy of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry, and completed a term as its Chair (2011–2014). He also completed two terms as the Director of Postgraduate Education for the Division of Child and Youth Mental Health, University of Toronto (2014–2022).

Dr Mary O'Regan

Dr. O'Regan is a Consultant Paediatric Neurologist at Children's Health Ireland, Crumlin and has a special interest in paediatric epilepsies. Before that, Dr. O'Regan served as a consultant paediatric neurologist in Glasgow, Scotland, initially at Yorkhill and later at the New Children's Hospital. Her interests lie in paediatric epilepsies, neonatal neurology, and neuroimmunology. She graduated from Trinity College Dublin in 1983 and completed her paediatric and paediatric neurology training in London and Edinburgh.

She held positions as the Lead Clinician for the Scottish Paediatric Epilepsy Network and as Chairperson of the Scottish Paediatric Neurology Group. Training the next generation of paediatricians and paediatric neurologists, both domestically and internationally, holds significant importance to Dr. O'Regan. She has consistently served as an educational supervisor and was a Deanery Advisory for Paediatric Neurology.

Dr. O'Regan played a key role in developing the Paediatric Epilepsy Training Courses conducted by the British Paediatric Neurology Training Courses and continues to be involved in teaching on these courses.
