Professor Harry G Kennedy

Prof Harry G Kennedy is Professor of Forensic Psychiatry at Trinity College Dublin, Ireland; Skou Professor of Forensic Psychiatry Aarhus University, Denmark; Visiting Professor of Forensic Psychiatry University of Bari Aldo Moro, Italy. Invited expert Committee for Prevention of Torture, inhuman and degrading treatment, Council of Europe; Invited expert International Criminal Court, The Hague.

Professor Felice Carabellese

Prof Felice Carabellese is full Professor of Forensic Psychiatry, University of Bari Aldo Moro Italy; Visiting Professor at Trinity College University of Dublin. Prof Carabellese's research interests includes evaluation of Forensic Mental Health Services in Italy, needs of female offenders and mental capacity.
